Councilman Stevenson commented that the VFW is closed on Sundays and inquired if the liquor license was an error. City Clerk, Arlene Silvey, stated that liquor licenses are handled through

the Collectors office. City Attorney, Anne Gardner, stated that the license was applied for on June 9, 2014 and suggested that the license be approved and if it is an error it will be brought back to Council for correction. Liquor License Renewals were approved on motion by Turley, seconded by LaStrada. All in favor.

DEPARTMENT BILLS thru June 16, 2014 totaling \$239,073.41 were approved for payment on motion by Cunningham, seconded by Meier. All in favor.

MISCELLANEOUS ITEMS FROM MAYOR/COUNCIL/ADMINISTRATOR:

Councilman Cunningham stated that the 1<sup>st</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> Wards will be hosting a town hall meeting at Katy Park from 5:30 p.m. to 7:00 p.m. on July 2, 2014.

GOOD & WELFARE:

Mike McGrath, with Missouri Department of Transportation, spoke regarding the ¾ cent sales tax that is coming up for vote August 2014. In May 2014, both the Senate and House of Representatives for the State approved legislation to put a transportation sales tax measure before Missouri voters and on May 23, 2014 Governor Nixon placed this amendment on the August 5, 2014 primary election ballot. Mr. McGrath stated that work is being done with Pioneer Trails to put together a list of projects for the Pioneer Trail Region, rural Kansas City area, and a comment period is available from June 13, 2014 to July 3, 2014 and July 9, 2014 the list of projects will be submitted to the Missouri Highways and Transportation Commission for approval.

**Amendment 7 Facts:**

- \$5.4 Billion to fund transportation projects over 10 years (2015 – 2025)
- 90% (\$480 million annually) will go toward state transportation initiatives – based on current revenues; 10% (\$54 million annually) to be split among cities (based on population percentage) and counties (number of miles of road maintained)
- Sales tax increase will not apply to purchases of medicine, groceries or gasoline
- Fuel tax will not increase and toll roads will not be implemented over the 10 year period
- Sales tax revenues can be used for any transportation purpose (rural/transit, bike and pedestrian accommodations, rail, ports and airport improvements)


**Public Comment Projects (affecting Pettis County):**

- I-70 Improvements
- Hwy 50 – 4 lanes from Jefferson City to Sedalia
- Oak Grove Lane Intersection upgrade
- Improve Route 65/Route 765 intersection North of Sedalia
- Connect Katy Trail from E. 3<sup>rd</sup> Street to Boonville St. across the Union Pacific railroad tracks
- Add sidewalks on Route 50 from Route 65 to Mitchell St. in Sedalia

Mr. McGrath stated that totals for Sedalia over 10 years will be \$1.468 million to be used on internal roads and goes to general funds. The City presently receives approximately \$780,000 per year which goes into the Capital Improvement Budget. Pettis County receives \$2.661 million over the 10 years or approximately \$266,000 per year.


