GOOD & WELFARE:



brutality in Ferguson, MO and Baltimore, MD, the City should have a plan to handle this kind of situation.



Ms. Laclaire added that her son, since moving to his residence at 1009 S. Ohio, has been having trouble with kids vandalizing his truck and an attempted break in of his apartment and has not been able to receive help from the Police Department when they are called or the police do not arrive in a timely manner.
