

NOTICE TO BIDDERS

Sealed Bids will be received by the City of Sedalia at the Office of the City Clerk in the Municipal Building, until 2:30 P.M. Thursday, April 30, 2015, for the **SIDEWALK PROJECT: 16TH STREET LAMINE TO INGRAM, Project 2015-01, dated April 1, 2015**, and will be publicly opened and read aloud in the second floor Conference Room.

The City of Sedalia is soliciting bids from regional contractors for work consisting of the installation of approximately 1,200 lineal feet of sidewalk to ADA regulations including truncated domes, tree removal, and all incidental and/or related work as necessary to provide a complete project.

The successful bidder shall meet with City staff to negotiate a firm contract for services before any work shall be commissioned. Prevailing wage rates applicable and have been predetermined as required by State Law.

Copies of Plans, Specifications, and Contract Documents for bidding purposes may be obtained at the office of the Public Works Director on the second floor of the Municipal Building, 200 South Osage Avenue. A twenty-dollar (\$20.00) non-refundable deposit is required for each set of plans and specifications. All bidders are required to submit their proposal on the printed forms contained in the Contract Documents. Proposals shall be submitted in a sealed envelope marked on the outside **"Sidewalk Project: 16th Street Lamine to Ingram"** with name of bidder. A bidders bond for the amount of 5% of the total amount of the bid made payable to the City of Sedalia must accompany each proposal.

Bidders are informed that the Project is subject to the requirements of Section 292.675, RSMo, which requires all contractors or subcontractors doing work on the Project to provide, and require its on-site employees to complete, a ten (10) hour course in construction safety and health approved by the Occupational Safety and Health Administration ("OSHA") or a similar program approved by the Missouri Department of Labor and Industrial Relations which is at least as stringent as an approved OSHA program. The training must be completed within sixty (60) days of the date work on the Project commences. On-site employees found on the worksite without documentation of the required training shall have twenty (20) days to produce such documentation. The City reserves the right to reject any or all bids and waive any irregularities in the bids. No bidder may withdraw his or her bid for a period of sixty (60) days after date of bid opening.

The City of Sedalia hereby notifies all bidders that it will affirmatively ensure that in any contract entered into pursuant to this advertisement, disadvantaged business enterprises will be afforded full opportunity to submit bids in response to this invitation and will not be discriminated against on the grounds of race, color, or national origin in consideration for an award.
