Public Safety Committee:

1. Review an ordinance related to a proposed agreement by and between the City of Sedalia and ProEnergy Contracting Services, LLC. The proposed agreement pertains to the temporary storage of the City's new fire truck beginning in early November at ProEnergy facilities until the new fire station is completed. There will be no storage costs to the city. It is anticipated that the new fire station will be able to accept the new fire truck late this year or early 2014. It is anticipated that the new fire truck may arrive in Sedalia in early November. Consequently, it was necessary to place this item on the current Council agenda. The proposed agreement was being prepared at the time the Council meeting packets were being distributed.

Public Works Committee:

1. Review bids for a vacuum truck for the water pollution control department. Four bids were received ranging from \$285,269 to \$308,700. Staff is recommending that Council accept the bid from Red Municipal and Industrial Equipment Company of Kansas City for \$308,700 because this was the only bid that met all specifications. \$350,000 is budgeted for the vacuum truck, so the bid from Red Municipal and Industrial Equipment is within budget. None of the bidding companies is from Sedalia. Staff recommends approval of the Red Municipal and Industrial Equipment Company bid.
2. Review an ordinance repealing Ordinance Numbers 8728 and 9429 by changing the 2-way stop at the intersection of West 10th Street and Winchester Drive to a 4-way stop. This ordinance was prepared at the request of the City Council. The Council will recall that differing points of view on this subject from councilmembers and the public were heard during the September 23, 2013 council meeting at which this topic was discussed. In order to resolve the issue, the Council requested that an ordinance mandating the four-way stop be prepared and presented to them so there can be a simple up or down vote on this item. The City's Traffic Advisory Commission researched this topic and earlier suggested that, based on federal guidelines, a four way stop not be installed at this location. Approval of the ordinance means a four-way stop at this intersection will be installed. If the ordinance is not approved, the four-way stop will not be installed.
3. Approve the purchase of office furniture for the Street Department through the Cooperative Purchasing Network. The purchase price is \$7,021.70. The purchase includes file cabinets, storage cabinets and desks. This proposed purchase is budgeted. Staff recommends approval of the purchase.
4. Review an ordinance that approves the final plat for VRE Sedalia, an addition to the City and being a replat of a portion of Lot 1 of Walton's subdivision to Sedalia (in front of Walmart) and dedicating public utility and roadway easements. The final plat was approved by the Planning and Zoning Commission at their September 3, 2013 meeting. All contingencies were met per the city requirements. This replat would create a separate parcel for the construction of an AT&T company retail store. Staff recommends approval of the final plat.

Finance/Administration Committee:

1. Review disposal of retired computer equipment proposal from Midwest Recycling Center. The Council will recall that it rejected a bid from a different company to charge the city approximately \$2,500 to pick-up and properly dispose of surplus computer equipment. City staff was not anticipating such a high cost. After the City Council rejected the bid, staff began looking at other options, including one from Midwest Recycling Center of Jefferson City. Midwest Recycling will pick-up our equipment at no charge and provide required documentation and certification for disposal. In other words, they will document that they have legally disposed of the computer equipment. Midwest Recycling has a long history of working with schools, local governments, state government and major industries to dispose of electronic equipment. Staff recommends that the Council approve the disposal of the equipment through Midwest Recycling Center.

PRE-COUNCIL MEETING – OCTOBER 7, 2013

WORK SESSION

The Work Session started at 6:00 p.m. in the Mayor's Conference Room at the Municipal Building with Mayor Pro-Tem Bob Cross presiding.

Council Members present were Stephen Galliher, Jo Lynn Turley, Rebecca LaStrada, Wanda Monsees, Wiley Walter, Bob Cross, Tolbert Rowe and Larry Stevenson.

Presentation – Fiscal Year 2012-2013 Audit Results

Fred Korte, of Gerding, Korte & Chitwood, reported on the City of Sedalia 2013 audit. Mr. Korte thanked City Administrator, Gary Edwards; Finance Director, Pam Burlingame; and City Clerk, Arlene Silvey and their staff for their help and the excellent job they did in providing information for the audit. Mr. Korte stated that the audit is conducted under Government Auditing Standards, and in the Internal Control Compliance there were no deficiencies found.

Total assets for 2013 were \$297,428,320 compared to \$292,870,715 in 2012; total net assets for 2013 were \$207,774,754 compared to \$205,811,861 in 2012. Assets exceeded liabilities by \$207,774,754 (\$52,415,397 unrestricted net assets). Net assets increased by \$1,962,984. Total revenues were \$18,215,390 with total expenditures being \$21,454,510; other financing sources at \$7,852,730; Health, Water and Sewer Revenues were \$99,947,264; total expenses were \$97,360,701; transfers of (\$461,704); net income of \$3,510,901. The City's General Fund showed an original budgeted deficit amount of \$1,432,881 over revenues but showed a final budgeted deficit amount of \$1,657,988; actual deficit amount of \$1,731,883. Health Department had a positive increase in funds from the beginning of the year. The Pension Fund for the City is 69% funded; \$3,878,332 is unfunded; Water Department has \$1,467,223 unfunded; and Health Department has \$5,156,005 unfunded. Mr. Korte reported that in 2016, there will be a new accounting standard where the City will have to show all unfunded liability.

Presentation – Afghanistan Trip

Municipal Judge, Deborah Mitchell, spoke about her time in Afghanistan through the Rule of Law Program working in the Gender Office. Mrs. Mitchell stated that most of the City and surrounding area were dirt and rock. The clothing she was required to wear was non-form fitting and she dressed in layers to deal with the changes in the weather. Mrs. Mitchell added that when dignitaries or other government officials were present she had to cover her head.

Mrs. Mitchell stated that tribal law is used and the men/elders on the tribal council make the laws. The people are not taught about the laws; they do only what they are told to do. The ACLEA classes of legal law, lasting 8 weeks, can be taken to learn about the laws in place. Also, there is no separation of church and state in the constitution.

Mrs. Mitchell thanked the Council for the opportunity for and support of her trip to Afghanistan through the Rule of Law Program. Judge Mitchell added that her trip has given her a new perspective on life which she is honored to have.

COMMITTEE MEETING

Public Safety Committee – Councilman Galliher, Chairman – No Report.

Public Works Committee – Councilman Rowe, Chairman, presented the following recommendations:

- Bids for Hook Lift Truck to be used by The Recycle Center to American Equipment Company in the amount of \$59,160 (\$50,286 paid by grant, thru Region F Planning Commission; \$8,874 matching portion paid by City) was moved to full Council on motion by Monsees, seconded by LaStrada. All in favor.
- Proposals for tree inventory of 1800 street right-of-way trees and Ordinance approving and accepting agreement with Plan-It Geo, LLC for a tree inventory of approximately 1,800 City right-of-way trees in the amount of \$10,150 (This is the next step related to the \$10,000 TRIM grant project from the Missouri Department of Conservation; also \$150 would come from city funds and \$3,500 would be covered by in-kind labor already performed on tree care maintenance) were moved to full Council on motion by LaStrada, seconded by Monsees. All in favor.
- Bids for Rock for the Street Department to both APAC-Kansas, Overland Park, KS and Boone Quarries, Sedalia, MO (they were not the low bidders however, they have local quarries which saves the City money in fuel costs for transportation of the rock and the vendor used depends on which side of town the work is being done) was moved to full Council on motion by Walter, seconded by LaStrada. All in favor.
- Change Order #1 from Heartland Finishes in the amount of \$380 for painting Street Department Building, change order is for the addition of painting overhead doors (Bringing contract total to \$5,480; item was mistakenly left out of the bid specifications) was moved to full Council on motion by LaStrada, seconded by Monsees. All in favor.
- Ordinance approving and accepting an agreement with the State of Missouri and Ideker, Inc. for the reconstruction of 5,000 feet of Runway 18-36 and replacement of the M.I.R.L. System at the Sedalia Regional Airport in the amount of \$3,376,968.39, which is significantly below the engineers estimate (95% to be paid with grant dollars, 5% to be paid by City and budgeted in the Fiscal Year 2015) was moved to full Council on motion by LaStrada, seconded by Walter. All in favor.
- Ordinance amending Ordinance No. 9940 relating to amending an existing classification and job description for Lab Technician for the Public Works Department and adding a new classification and job description for Permit/Environmental Control Specialist for the Public Works Department (no extra cost to City) in the City of Sedalia, Missouri was moved to full Council on motion by LaStrada, seconded by Monsees. All in favor.

- Ordinance amending Section 7.15(C) (Controlled Substance and Alcohol Testing Policy – Applicability) of the City of Sedalia’s Personnel Regulations Manual by adding the title of Permit/Environmental Control Specialist for the Public Works Department to employee positions designated as safety sensitive was moved to full Council on motion by Monsees, seconded by LaStrada. All in favor.

Finance/Administration Committee – Councilman Turley, Chairman presented the following recommendations:

- Bids for the Phone Maintenance/Repair/Service to Custom Communications, Sedalia, MO in the amount of \$4,183 (previously bids were done every two years, however, this year the bid is for a month-by-month basis for a period up to one year, option to extend for an additional year; due to a possible phone upgrade or replacement) was moved to full Council on motion by LaStrada, seconded by Monsees. All in favor.
- Recommendation to reject bid for the Sale of Retired Computer Equipment (hopes were to receive a bid that would agree to buy the surplus computer equipment and dispose of the unusable parts in accordance with state requirements); one bid was received from Synetic Technologies of Kansas City to charge \$2,500; was moved to full Council on motion by Monsees, seconded by LaStrada. All in favor.
- Records Destruction Request from the Personnel Department was moved to full Council on motion by Rowe, seconded by LaStrada. All in favor.
- Ordinance repealing Section 2-763, enacting a new Section 2-763 (needed language updates in records, meetings and votes to reflect current Sunshine Law) and amending the fee schedule for Section 2-809 (pertains to updates in information requests, procedures and fees that more accurately reflect expenses incurred by the City for performing this service) of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Sedalia, Missouri relating to open and closed meetings and records of the City of Sedalia, Missouri was moved to full Council on motion by LaStrada, seconded by Rowe. All in favor.
- Ordinance approving and accepting an agreement with Art Davis Group, LLC for a goal setting work session to assist the Mayor and City Council in developing short and long-term strategic goals, in the amount of \$3,000 (City Administrator Edwards suggested additional \$500 for a total not to exceed \$3,500 to cover cost of including department heads with this project; meeting date for this session is currently set for January 11, 2014) was moved to full Council on motion by Monsees, seconded by LaStrada. All in favor.

City Administrator, Gary Edwards, stated that the Tour of the Cemetery Department set for October 14, 2013 has been postponed. Administrator Edwards asked if there were any Councilmembers who preferred to not be contacted by email; none of the Councilmembers objected to be contacted by email.

Councilman LaStrada made a motion to rescind the smoking ban ordinance and classifying a bar under 60(alcohol)/40(food) ratio; seconded by Monsees. City Administrator, Gary Edwards, stated that this issue was not on the agenda therefore it could not be addressed at this meeting.

City Attorney, Anne Gardner, stated that there would have to be 24 hour notice for the special work session to rescind the smoking ban ordinance. Councilman Galliher and Stevenson stated that more time should be allowed before acting on this ordinance. Councilman Walter, Monsees, and LaStrada stated that businesses need to be protected. Councilman Rowe stated that before action is taken the Council needs to sit down and discuss the issue. Council consensus was to have a work session for discussion only on the smoking ban ordinance on Saturday, October 12, 2013 at 8:00 a.m.

With no further comments, the meeting closed at 7:08 p.m.

Quincy; Becky Hawkins; Steve Hayworth, 22325 Anderson School Road; and Rebecca LaKemper, 1463 Airport Road, Apt. B voiced their concerns on the no smoking ban, business has declined and people are losing their jobs. Several felt that the smoking ban should include private clubs as well as bars to be fair.

Dennis Nicholson, Dresden, stated that he comes to Sedalia to enjoy watching racing and sports, dance and enjoy karaoke while having a cigarette and the smoking ban has ruined his experience here.

Tracy Karigan, stated that she does not smoke, however, she believes that if someone does not like cigarette smoke then they do not have to go into that establishment. Ms. Karigan added that it should be up to the business owner whether to allow smoking or not.

Lou Ann Eschbacher, 22495 N. Woods Road, Smithton, stated that there could be a solution to bars allowing smoking by becoming private clubs.



COUNCIL WORK SESSION – OCTOBER 12, 2013

WORK SESSION

The Work Session started at 8:00 a.m. in the Mayor's Conference Room at the Municipal Building.

Council Members present were Stephen Galliher, Jo Lynn Turley, Rebecca LaStrada, Wanda Monsees, Wiley Walter, Bob Cross, Tolbert Rowe, and Larry Stevenson.

Discussion on Smoke Free Ordinance in reference to bars and private clubs

Mayor Horn stated that the meeting was for Council discussion to give direction to City staff and no vote will be taken. There will also be no public input because the public voiced their concerns at the last 2 council meetings.

City Administrator, Gary Edwards, added that at the October 7, 2013 Council Meeting it was decided to review the Smoke Free Ordinance in regards to bars and private clubs.

City Attorney, Anne Gardner, presented a brief history on the Smoke Free Ordinance. Attorney Gardner gave key definitions for Bars, Private Clubs, Restaurants, and Smoking; as well as the penalties which includes warnings, fines and possible revocation of business license.

Administrator Edwards stated that the ordinance has only been in effect for one month and that Council has to consider that their policy making integrity may be jeopardized if an amendment is made to the ordinance. Administrator Edwards stated that good arguments were presented to the Council by local bar owners regarding including private clubs in the smoking ban or to exempt bars. Administrator Edwards provided four discussion items:

- Amend Smoke Free Ordinance by including private clubs as smoke free areas
- Leave Smoke Free Ordinance as it stands
- Amend Smoke Free Ordinance and allow smoking at public bars
- Repeal entire ordinance

Councilman Galliher stated that he has been hearing from bar owners that they would like the smoking ban to include private clubs to be fair. Mr. Galliher added that more time should be given to see if the smoking ordinance will work.

Councilman Monsees stated that including private clubs in the smoking ban does not level the field because patrons can still go to bars outside city limits. Ms. Monsees added that she would support an amendment exempting bars from the smoking ban ordinance and would be in favor of a 60/40 split in the definition of a bar.

Councilman LaStrada stated that banning smoking in private clubs is not right especially since most members are veterans. Ms. LaStrada stated that bars have had to lay off employees and if they close the city loses tax revenue. Ms. LaStrada added that bars should be excluded from the smoking ban and suggested enacting a 60/40 rule, allowing bars that make less than 60% of its revenue on food to be

excluded from the ban. City Attorney, Anne Gardner, stated that this could be difficult to track and get accurate numbers.

Councilman Cross stated that private clubs and bars should be exempt from the smoking ban and initially wanted the issue to be on a ballot. Mr. Cross added that he did not want to see bars closing and is in favor of a 60/40 split which would allow bars to have the same rights as the private clubs.

Councilman Walter agreed with Cross that private clubs and bars should be exempt from the smoking ban and added that the Council initially agreed that if the ban would cost jobs or money the Council would rescind the ordinance.

Councilman Stevenson stated that private clubs should be exempt. Clubs have a lot of requirements to get in and not just anyone can walk in off the street. Mr. Stevenson stated that if a business is licensed as a bar there is no need for the 60/40 split in the definition. Attorney Gardner stated that it would be difficult to determine a 60/40 split in defining a bar because licenses are based off of receipts and when a business is just starting it is based off of a standard starting amount. This could put some restaurants under the definition of a bar. Mr. Stevenson added that more time should be given to see if the ordinance will work.

Councilman Turley stated that there needs to be a level playing field. Ms. Turley stated that 40% of food sales is not an incidental amount and that if this was done it should be a 20% in food sales. Ms. Turley added that more time is needed to see if the smoking ordinance can work. Ms. Turley also added that business owners should be proactive in promoting their business.

Councilman Rowe stated that he would stand by his original vote to enact the smoking ban.

Mayor Horn read an email from a 6th year veteran on the Jefferson City Council encouraging the City Council to remain strong in their stance on the smoking ban ordinance, even with the push to weaken it by some people, and that it takes time to see the rewards.

Administrator Edwards presented each option for a show of hands:

- Option 1 – Amend Smoke Free Ordinance by including private clubs as smoke free areas:
No one in favor.
- Option 2 – Leave Smoke Free Ordinance as it stands:
Councilman Galliher, Turley, Walter and Rowe were in favor.
- Option 3 – Amend Smoke Free Ordinance and allow smoking in public bars:
Councilman Monsees, LaStrada, Cross and Stevenson were in favor.
- Option 4 – Repeal entire ordinance:
No one in favor.

With a 4-4 split between the Council on leaving the Smoke Free Ordinance as is or excluding bars from the smoking ban, Mayor Horn stated that the smoking ordinance would stay as it is.

Administrator Edwards stated that the Council could revisit this issue in 60 days.

With no further comments, the meeting closed at 8:50 a.m.

OTHER ITEMS FOR DISCUSSION:

10th and Winchester discussion – Cross explained that City Council will be discussing the intersection of 10th & Winchester on September 23rd. The recent items in the SedLine portion of the Sedalia Democrat have prompted the Council to discuss the intersection. Also there were some petitions submitted to council. This discussion will be at the pre-council meeting on September 23rd and it was requested Traffic Advisory Commission attend if possible, at least Heembrock since she is Chairman. Cross explained that a summary of the items that had been presented to Traffic Advisory concerning this intersection, as well as their recommendation to Council, had been given to Mr. Edwards. This information also has the Manual for Uniform Traffic Control Devices criteria for a multi-way stop.

Heembrock asked if Council had been given the petitions. Cross thought they had been given to Council already. Neff asked why the petitions were submitted to Council and not Traffic Advisory. Cross explained the petitions did not specifically request anything, it only stated they had concerns with this intersection. Heembrock asked if there were any restrictions as to who could sign the petitions; Cross stated she did not really know the legal requirements but there were signatures on the petitions of people who did not live in Sedalia. Esquivel stated she would be interested in how many of those people are actual drivers.

Neff stated she went to this intersection at 6:00 p.m. on Sunday and stayed there for about 15 minutes. She saw about 25% of the vehicles going over the speed limit; 3 or 4 people who did not really even stop at the stop sign on 10th; more people were going north on Winchester than south; one vehicle was going real fast. She also drove by Winchester Meadows to see how many vehicles were in the parking lot and then looked at the new housing being built on Mitchell. The question was asked what kind of housing was being built on Mitchell. Cross explained it will be independent living and every unit will have a garage so the potential is there for every unit to have a driver. Cross also stated the Winchester Meadows is adding two more buildings.

Cross stated the time has not been set for the pre-council meeting but as soon as that is determined Cross will let the Commission know via email or phone.

There was more discussion about traffic being backed up on Winchester if the 4-way stop is installed. That might cause more trouble.

Heembrock asked if Council has been given the petitions. Cross stated she did not know for sure but she does know the City Administrator does have the petitions. Heembrock also asked if Cross could check with Anne Gardner to see if the petitions were considered legal petitions. Cross stated she would check with Gardner. Neff stated she would like to know how many Councilmen have been out to observe the intersection and she also stated she would check with the Council to see if they have.

Esquivel stated Emily Jarrett, Sedalia Democrat reporter, contacted her about this intersection. Jarrett was going to do a story. Cross stated there was an article in the paper and Jarrett contacted Chief DeGonia and Bill Beck.

Neff asked if the whole committee should attend the Council meeting. Cross stated Mr. Edwards requested that someone from the committee be there but it is an open to the public and all are welcome. Heembrock asked if a decision is going to be made at the meeting. Cross explained that Mr. Edwards was asking Council to discuss the issue and give staff some direction. Neff asked if the traffic count information will be given to Council. Cross stated yes it will be given to Council.





Title VI County, Township & Political Subdivision Government
Chapter 70 Powers of Political Subdivisions to Cooperate or Contract with Governmental
Units

§ 70.210: Definitions.

As used in sections 70.210 to 70.320, the following terms mean:

- 1) "Governing body", the board, body or persons in which the powers of a municipality or political subdivision are vested;
- 2) "Municipality", municipal corporations, political corporations, and other public corporations and agencies authorized to exercise governmental functions;
- 3) "Political subdivision", counties, townships, cities, towns, villages, school, county library, city library, city-county library, road, drainage, sewer, levee and fire districts, soil and water conservation districts, watershed subdistricts, county hospitals, and any board of control of an art museum, and any other public subdivision or public corporation having the power to tax.

§ 70.220: Political subdivisions may cooperate with each other, with other states, the United States or private persons

- 1) Any municipality or political subdivision of this state, as herein defined, may contract and cooperate with any other municipality or political subdivision, or with an elective or appointive official thereof, or with a duly authorized agency of the United States, or of this state, or with other states or their municipalities or political subdivisions, or with any private person, firm, association or corporation, for the planning, development, construction, acquisition or operation of any public improvement or facility, or for a common service; provided, that the subject and purposes of any such contract or cooperative action made and entered into by such municipality or political subdivision shall be within the scope of the powers of such municipality or political subdivision.
- 4) If any contract or cooperative action entered into under this section is between a municipality or political subdivision and an elective or appointive official of another municipality or political subdivision, such contract or cooperative action shall be approved by the governing body of the unit of government in which such elective or appointive official resides.

MRC Recycling is a Missouri company that has been in business for over 13 years serving hundreds of schools and businesses. MRC is a specialist in electronics and appliances recycling with the goal of properly diverting as many tons of electronics and appliances from the landfill as possible by offering convenient solutions to the ongoing issues of identity theft and environmental liability.

We are registered with the EPA (EPA ID # MOR000533174), and are level 4 state certified by the Missouri Department of Natural Resources (MO ID # 043500). Annual inspections are done by the Missouri Department of Natural Resources and quarterly reports are made to the St. Louis Solid Waste Management District with regards to our procedures, documentation, and end markets for materials.

MRC's main processing facility is a 53,000 sq. ft. warehouse located at 915 5th St. Park Hills, Missouri. We have three other drop-off facilities located in South County, Crystal City, Cape Girardeau, and Jefferson City Missouri. These facilities manage IT, the destruction of information and the reuse division of our business.

The proper destruction of hard drives and the information contained on them is an essential service MRC offers. We have four different methods in which we are able to protect our clients' valuable information. Depending on the requirements of each client, MRC is able to wipe hard drives with data sanitation software compliant with Department of Defense standards, destroy the information on site with portable equipment such as an industrial degausser or hydraulic hole punch, or by shredding at our South County facility. All the tools utilized by MRC are made specifically for the purpose of protecting our clients by destroying all of their stored personal data.

MRC follows all of the laws, guidelines and Best Management Practices (BMPs) put forth by the EPA. We keep our clients from becoming a PRP (Potentially Responsible Party) of any electronic material as well as keep all material from falling into the category of hazardous waste by fully complying with the Resource Conservation Recovery Act (RCRA), Comprehensive Response Compensation and Liability Act

(CERCLA), Toxic Substance Control Act, Clean Air Act, and the Clean Water Act. MRC does this by keeping all material in what the EPA and DNR consider a "Documented Recycling Loop." We maintain and document all electronic material from the transfer of ownership from your company to MRC and then to the end markets, preventing the electronic material from being considered "hazardous waste." MRC is also compliant with E-verify law requirements.

Jeff Porter, co-owner of MRC, and additional staff have Freon training and certification. All of their Freon recovery equipment is registered with the EPA.

MRC follows the mantra of Recycling, "Reduce, Reuse, and Recycle." Based on the requirements of each client, MRC either demanufactures items down to a component level, or finds a home for the item to be reused. Since reuse is the most environmentally friendly form of recycling, we try to reuse items in the form of parts or as a working unit (as long as the client does not require the item be destroyed). Once all recycled material is broken down to a component level, such as steel, aluminum, plastic, lead, etc., it is shipped to an EPA approved facility to be shredded and separated further. The raw material is then melted or smelted and recycled back into a new product. Since MRC has a zero landfill policy, none of your material will end up in the landfill. We can provide documentation to show proper data destruction and/or recycling.

MRC is one of only two electronics recycling companies that are Level 4 certified by the Missouri Department of Natural Resources (DNR). Our Level 4 certification ID # is RR0585. What this means to our clients:

MRC has been inspected by Missouri DNR as to how all electronic material is managed and processed as well as having an environmental management system in place. We are able to provide documentation from cradle to grave on where all electronic material ends up.

MRC also has a performance bond and closure plan. In the unfortunate event we should close our facilities, the closure plan and bond will instruct and pay for an EPA approved third party to provide proper handling and recycling of any material in their possession. This takes all liability off of the individual or company that is a client, with regards to the proper handling of any of their obsolete electronics in MRC's facilities.

If you have an outdated computer or two in your basement or old cell phones packed away in a box, you're not alone. According to the Consumer Electronics Association, Americans own approximately 24 electronic products per household. With a constant supply of newer, faster electronic products on the market, older models are continually replaced. As a result, electronics have become one of the fastest growing waste streams. The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency estimates that more than 2 million tons of televisions, cell phones, computer products and other electronics are disposed each year. Currently, only about 20 percent of these materials are recycled.

To Support Your Community - By donating your unwanted, working electronics to a school or charity, you are providing that school, a low-income family, or non-profit agency with refurbished computers, cell phones, and other electronics. You are helping that person or group access technology that they could not otherwise afford.

To Conserve Our Natural Resources - Valuable material can be recovered from old electronics, and these materials can be used to make new products. Did you know gold, copper and other precious metals are used in computer circuit boards and other electronic components? Lead, glass and plastics are used in televisions and computer monitors. By recovering and reusing these materials, we reduce the need to mine for new raw materials. Besides being possibly disruptive to the environment, mining requires large amounts of energy.

E-cycle Missouri is a program designed by private, public and nonprofit recyclers, federal, state and local governments, manufacturers, environmental groups and retail organizations to provide you with the how and where information you need to recycle your electronics. 
Special Note For Businesses, Non-Profits, Schools

Did you know that all businesses, non-profits, schools and public agencies in Missouri are required by law to properly manage certain discarded electronics? Some electronics may be classified as hazardous waste. Computer monitors, televisions, circuit boards and other electronics contain heavy metals so they cannot legally be disposed in the trash. Reuse or recycling through a registered e-cycle Missouri recycler will help ensure that your facility complies with the law.

Missouri e-cycle Standards for Best Management Practices

The Missouri e-cycle Standards, also known as MOEST, were developed to identify common sense strategies that define best management practices for collecting, processing and transporting e-scrap in Missouri that protects the environment. E-cycling businesses that adopt these standards are committed to the responsible management of end-of-life electronic equipment, components and materials. To confirm this commitment, a corporate officer or non-profit board member must sign a certification statement indicating the business uses MOEST as its standard operating procedure.

A. General Operations

1. Follow all applicable environmental laws and regulations. This includes notification, permit and registration requirements, if applicable.
2. Maintain documentation of environmental, safety and security audits by regulatory agencies.
3. Maintain general liability insurance coverage. Make certificate copies available to upstream sources (generators/suppliers).
4. Maintain and document a plan to close the facility.

B. Inventory Control

1. Keep a detailed and complete inventory of all equipment coming in and the components and materials going out. This inventory should document the material that is being processed.
2. Document the transfer of ownership of all electronic equipment, components and materials received.
3. Provide documentation of tax-deductible donations of equipment (non-profit organizations), if applicable.
4. Maintain a level of recycling at or above 90 percent.

C. Maximize Value, Minimize Risk


1. Evaluate electronic equipment and components to determine their functional value, using the following hierarchy of management options, in order of preference:
 - o Reuse.
 - o Repair, refurbishment, remanufacturing.
 - o Recovery of functional components.
 - o Recycling of constituent materials.
2. Remove components of concern such as fluorescent tubes, mercury-containing switches and relays, leaded glass and lithium and nickel-cadmium batteries before shredding equipment for recycling, unless excluded by environmental regulation.
3. Audit downstream vendors in the chain of custody, both domestic and international, requiring documentation of regulatory compliance and responsible recycling and disposal of materials.

D. Responsible Export Practices

1. Follow all applicable environmental laws and regulations, including country-specific import or export regulations.
2. Maintain documentation for exports of electronic equipment and components from the United States, including:
 - o Shipping manifests identifying the recipient and showing make, model and condition for all declared reuse items.
 - o Any other information necessary to complete the export.
3. Tested, working cathode ray tubes, electronic equipment and raw materials resulting from demanufacturing can be exported. All other electronic equipment is excluded from export except to countries that meet the following criteria:
 - o Members of the Organization for Economic Cooperation and Development.
 - o Members of the European community.
 - o Countries that have entered into an agreement with the United States that allow for such export.

E. Transportation Practices

Follow cathode ray tube regulations listed in the Code of Federal Regulations at 40 CFR 261.39 regarding transport, storage and labeling CRTs in transport.



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Ready to Recycle

When we talk about electronic products, we are talking about more than just televisions, cell phones and computer products. We are also referring to DVD players, VCRs, video cameras, digital cameras, gaming consoles, stereos, answering machines, photocopiers, scanners, printers and the list goes on. When you decide that it's time to trade up your product for a newer model, consider these possibilities before you pull the plug:

- **Reuse It** - You can add memory or other upgrades to old computers. You can connect your gaming systems, VCRs or DVD players to working televisions.
- **Donate It** - Schools, nursing homes and other organization might have a need for a television to watch movies or even training videos. Computers can be refurbished and used for a variety of things. Cell phones can be used as emergency use cell phones for the elderly, disabled, battered women's shelters, etc.
- **Recycle It** - There are environmentally friendly options available to recycle, instead of throw away, old electronic products. A legitimate electronics recycler can remove potentially hazardous materials. Doing so will not only help prevent those materials from accidentally being exposed to the environment but also means the materials can be reused to make new products.

Where to Recycle

- Under Missouri's Electronics Scrap Management Rule, any covered computer equipment bought in Missouri after July 1, 2010, comes with a recovery plan that specifies how the computer equipment manufacturer will collect and recycle that equipment when you no longer want it, **at no cost to you**. Covered computer equipment bought before July 1, 2010, and manufactured under a brand by a company still selling computers in Missouri will also be eligible for free and convenient recycling. The computer equipment manufacturers listed on the Missouri Department of Natural Resources' Registered Computer Equipment Manufacturers List have an approved recovery plan. If you need more information, contact the department's Solid Waste Management Program by email.
- Participate in a collection event listed on e-cycle Missouri's E-cycling Events Web page.
- Take your unwanted electronics to one of the recyclers listed on the Missouri Department of Natural Resources' Registered Electronics Recycling Businesses List. If you need more information, call the department's Hazardous Waste Program at 573-751-3176 or 800-361-4827.
- Participate in a collection event hosted by your city, county or solid waste management district. If you need more information, call the department's Solid Waste Program at 800-361-4827.
- Contact electronics retailers in your community to find out if they have a take-back or recycling program.
- Visit EPA's website for a list of manufacturer, retailer, donation and recycling programs.
- Visit EPA's Plug-In To eCycling Web page for links to manufacturers and retailers that collect, reuse or recycle old electronics.

EPA estimates that in 2009:

- 438 million new electronic products were sold;
- 5 million short tons of electronic products were in storage;
- 2.37 million short tons of electronic products were ready for end-of-life management; and
- 25 percent of these tons were collected for recycling.

What to Recycle

Each collection site has its own list of accepted items and fees, if applicable. The most commonly accepted items are:

- Computers - CPUs, monitors, keyboards, mice.
- Printers.
- Televisions.
- Hand held devices.
- Cell phones.

Note: Fees are often necessary to cover the recycler's costs to dispose of the hazardous components. Check with the individual recycler to find out more about their services and fees.

Registered Electronics Recycling Businesses List

This is a list of e-cycling businesses that recycle or dispose electronic equipment in Missouri. The list below contains only Missouri businesses that have registered with the department's Voluntary Tiered Registration Program. This list is not intended as an endorsement or warranty to any company or product by or from the Missouri Department of Natural Resources.

When a Missouri e-cycling business registers with the department, they choose to register at one of four levels. As the tier levels increase, so do the amount of regulations the business needs to follow. We indicate the businesses registration level by the number of **S** next to its name. This will help you choose a recycler at the registration level that best meets your needs.

- **Level 1** - This business agreed to recycle as much of their demanufactured electronic material as possible.
- **Level 2** - This business met all Level 1 requirements and adopted the Missouri e-cycle Standards, or MOEST, Best Management Practices as its standard operating procedures. The business will complete a yearly Host Site Self-Audit and the department will make it available in the table below.
- **Level 3** - This business met all Level 1 and 2 requirements and demonstrated financial responsibility for closing cost. They do this by entering into a legal contract with another registered e-cycling business or an environmental company to properly close the facility or by showing that they have resources set aside to pay for closure costs, even if they declare bankruptcy.
- **Level 4** - This business met all Level 1, 2 and 3 requirements and had their Environmental Management System certified by a third party organization.
